SCOPE OF WORK

The San Mateo-Foster City School District (District) is the Lead Agency and the representative for the Super Co-Op, a USDA Foods cooperative in California. For the 2021-22 school year, the Super Co-Op is comprised of 235 California recipient agencies eligible to receive and process USDA Foods, with a combined average daily participation of over 1.3 million lunches per day, representing over 234 million Total Lunches Served (TLS) per school year, and approximately \$87 million in entitlement funding to purchase USDA Foods. District locations vary from Red Bluff in the north to Chula Vista in the south and are of varying sizes.

This document requests pricing from approved USDA Foods processing manufacturers for Super Co-Op Member District. Final purchases get made through an approved Super Co-Op distributor in California. **This price catalog is not a formal solicitation and no awards will be made.** Super Co-Op Member Districts indicate their intent to utilize a manufacturer through a survey process and USDA Foods bulk diversions are made pursuant to the results of that survey. Also, the diversion of raw USDA Foods to a manufacturer does not guarantee sales; the manufacturer must work with Member Districts to facilitate sales through local Member District procurement solicitations. Prices offered by vendors through this price catalog are not intended to be used for direct delivery sales. Pass Through Value will only be granted for manufacturers and products listed in this price catalog.

INSTRUCTIONS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Price Catalog: Documents must be submitted via email to Andrew Soliz at asoliz@smfc.k12.ca.us no later than 4:00pm PST on March 5, 2021. Both unit price and extension (where applicable) for all line items must be shown where required on the Information Submission Worksheet. Signatures may be electronic. Prices should be stated in units specified herein.
- **2.** Respondent's Conference: A Webinar, for the purpose of acquainting processors with the unique requirements of the District and the Super Co-Op, will be held on February 10, 2021, at 11:30 AM PST via Webinar. Webinar information will be posted at www.Super-Coop.org one week prior to the event.
- **3. Pricing:** Prices quoted shall be for all Super Co-Op member districts (Attachment A), utilizing an approved Co-Op distributor.
- **4. Price Catalog Terms:** Minimum contract term is one (1) year. Quoted prices must stay in effect for one (1) year beginning on July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.
- **5.** <u>Multi-Year Extensions:</u> Pursuant to California Education Code, Section 17596, this price catalog may be extended (by mutual consent expressed in writing) for up to two (2) additional one (1) year increments total potential life of three (3) years from July 1, 2021.
- **6. FOB:** All pricing is FOB delivered to the Super Co-Op approved USDA Foods distributor(s). All freight charges must be included in the price. Any minimum delivery amounts must be listed with the price. The vendor also may provide plant direct pricing and bracket pricing based on full or partial truckload quantities. Proposer may add additional lines as needed to be clear about bracket pricing.
- 7. <u>Acceptance of Pricing:</u> This price catalog is not a formal solicitation and no awards will be made. This document is a price catalog for Approved Super Co-Op Distributors which provides full transparency of pricing into distribution.
 - a. Each member of the cooperative must conduct their own procurement process to obtain final delivered cost of processed USDA Foods and commercial equivalents from the member district's awarded distributor.
 - b. USDA Processors may provide pricing on any food items that are USDA Foods end products or are the commercial equivalent of such products to be considered.
 - c. New products and price decreases will be considered in November each year requesting pricing January 1 June 30.
 - d. Pass Through Value will only be granted for manufacturers and products included in this price catalog and have received diversions of USDA raw material.
- **8.** Errors and Corrections: Verify your pricing before submission as they cannot be corrected after being collated or withdrawn until after the specified time period has elapsed.

- **9. Agreements between Processors and Distributors:** Per 7 CFR 250.30(i), a processor (vendor) providing end products containing donated foods to a distributor must enter into a written agreement with the distributor. The agreement must reference, at a minimum, the financial liability for the replacement value of donated foods, not less than monthly end product sales reporting frequency, requirements in §250.11, and applicable value pass through system to ensure the value of donated foods and finished end products are properly credited to Recipient Agencies.
- **10.** <u>Insufficient or Non-Appropriated Funds or USDA Food Products:</u> The processor understands that monies utilized by the District and its member districts is public money appropriated by the State of California or acquired by the District and Districts from similar public sources and is subject to variation. The District fully reserves the right to limit quantities of items due to non-availability or non-appropriation of sufficient funds and/or lack of availability of USDA Foods products.
- **11.** Warranty/Quality: The vendor, manufacturer, or his assigned agent shall guarantee the food products against all defects.
- **12.** Summary End Product data Schedules (SEPDS): SEPDS forms for all processed USDA Foods products offered in this price catalog shall match exactly on the pricing form provided.
